1. Quality Standards for CEIAG in Calderdale & Kirklees (*Supports all the National Standards)
The local Quality Standards have been revised so they are mapped against the National Standards for Young People's IAG. A version has also been developed for Work Based Learning and Training Providers. The revised standards also meet the requirements of the Statutory Guidance: Impartial Careers Education. Support is offered to self-assess against the revised standards, complete the self evaluation form and prepare for assessment.

2. Updating your CEIAG programme (*Supports all the National Standards)
New ideas for bringing your CEIAG learning alive. Introducing the DCSF Resources Pack, Ways & Choices Materials, websites for careers.

3. CEIAG Introductory/Refresher course for Careers Co-ordinators (*Supports National Standards 8, 10 & 11)
Find out about good practice in managing CEIAG and get updated on new developments. Continued professional development for staff involved in co-ordinating careers education.

4. Developing CEIAG with parents, carers and families and involving young people in CEIAG. (*Supports National Standards 6 & 7)
How do we engage with parents, carers and families to help them support their child's career decisions and choices? What resources are available? How do we involve young people in CEIAG?

5. Helping Young People to make better post 16 choices (*Supports National Standards 2, 3, 4, 5 & 10)
How can we contribute to the reduction in the number of young people who are not in Education, Employment or Training (NEET)? In the light of the requirement for schools to provide impartial CEIAG this session provides information on apprenticeships, labour market information and trends, the destinations of last year's Year 11 and how to use the local 14-19 area prospectus.

6. Supporting personal tutors in the delivery of impartial CEIAG and transition for young people (*Supports National Standards 3, 4, 5, 8 & 10)
Training for tutors to develop information, advice and guidance skills, includes listening, questioning and interview skills. Also information on opportunities and progression routes.
