1. Quality Standards for CEIAG in Calderdale & Kirklees (*Supports all the National Standards)

The local Quality Standards have been revised so they are mapped against the National Standards for Young People's IAG. A local Standard has also been developed for WBL and Training Providers. Support is offered to self-assess against the revised standards, complete the SEF and prepare for assessment.

2. CEG Resources/CEG Toolkit

(*Supports National Standards 2, 3 & 5)
Access to advice on CEG resources and publications eg The Real Game, Careers Education lesson materials for year 7-11 (PSHEE toolkit), Ways and Choices lesson plans, STEM materials, Careers Education for young people with LDD or in work based training. We have a resource base and materials can be borrowed on request.

3. Making sense of CEIAG in Years 7 and 8

(*Supports National Standards 1, 2, 3 & 9)
The opportunity to review and plan provision in Year 7 and 8. Careers Education at an earlier age is increasingly important given the complexity of

choices now available - does your programme reflect this?

4. Spring clean your CEIAG Provision

(*Supports National Standards 8, 10 & 11)

Are you aware of 14-19 strategy and reforms, IAG within Diplomas and the National Standard for Young People's IAG?

Do you need to review your policy and practice to reflect these?

5. Helping Young People to make better post 16 choices

(*Supports National Standards 2, 3, 4, 5 & 10)

How can we contribute to the reduction in the number of young people who are not in Education, Employment or Training (NEET)? In the light of the requirement for schools to provide impartial IAG this provides information on Apprenticeships, labour market info and trends, destinations of last year's Year 11 and how to use the local 14-19 area prospectus.

6. Tutoring and Guidance skills

Training for tutors to develop information, advice and guidance skills.

Includes listening, questioning and interview skills. Also information on opportunities and progression routes.
