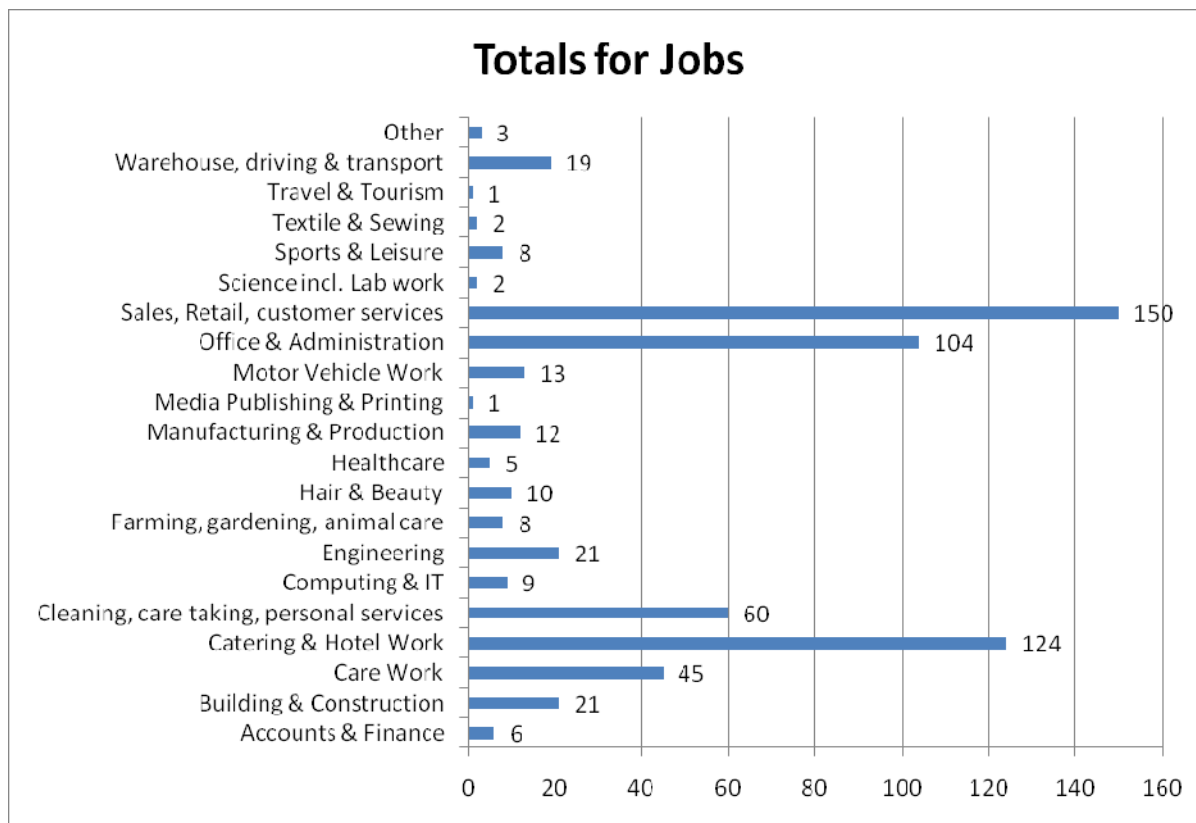


Report on Annual Statistics

Introduction

This short report introduces and explains statistics that have been derived from a data spreadsheet. The graph shows how many young people were placed in vacancies and in which area of work during the period 1 September 2008 to 30 August 2009.



- Most people were employed in sales and retail however the majority of recruits were taken on in the first quarter but recruitment remained reasonably strong throughout the remainder of the year.
- Catering and hotel work, and office and administration also recruited a lot of young people.
- The most popular work area for recruiting young people seems to be around work in customer services such as supermarkets and other retail outlets like next. Also office and administration and hotel work.
- This graph shows that a lot of young people seem to find work in general services.

The work areas that are taking on fewer young people are:

- Accounts & Finance
- Media and Publishing
- Travel and Tourism
- Textile and sewing
- Science including lab work
- Health care
- Sports & Leisure
- Computing & IT

Conclusion

Overall the trend for employing young people seems to lean towards IT and general services in the centre of towns and cities. There are fewer opportunities to work in industrial placements and physical/mechanical work.

Over the year there seems to be more vacancies in IT based companies in office than in main industries. Also retail outlet positions are still taking up a large chunk of the job market for young people.
